

Sports Premium Projected Spend/Impact 2019

The Wolds Federation Sports Premium 2018-2019

At The Wolds Federation we believe PE & Sport plays an important role in making our vision statement a reality for every pupil, with potential to change young people's lives for the better.

We have welcomed the Government's announcement in June 2013 to provide additional funding until 2020 to improve provision of physical education and sport in primary schools. We are committed to using this resource in developing high quality PE lessons, alongside greater opportunities for sporting competitions and clubs for all our young people. Sport Premium Grant Funding for schools will be calculated by the number of primary aged pupils (between the ages of 5 and 11). All the schools with 17 or more primary aged pupils will receive a lump sum of £16,000 plus a premium of £10 per pupil. Smaller schools will receive £1000 per pupil.

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Key achievements to date:	Areas for further improvement and baseline evidence of need:
Our federation has competed in 95% of School Sport competition held this year. As a small federation we are very proud and hope to continue this in the coming years. We have competed in a variety of sports including football, netball, cross country and indoor athletics. We have also achieved success in two competitions winning the tag rugby and hockey tournaments. Every child is participating in high quality physical education each week. Lunchtime and after school clubs for both KS1 and KS2 are well attended with an increase on numbers from the previous year. Children get the chance to participate in a variety of different sports. The introduction of year 6 play leaders has had a huge impact on the number of children taking part in physical activity during break and lunchtimes. Play leaders has had a positive effect on interaction between pupils and lunchtime staff have reported an improvement in behaviour. Each child across KS2 has the opportunity to participate in a range of competitive sports throughout the year. We have continued to work with stagecoach and the children receive a series of high quality dance and gymnastics sessions each year. We once again have achieved our bronze mark for the school's game award.	Many children have given positive feedback that they enjoy being active during the school day and the play leaders have had a big impact on this. However, there has been a slow stream of children attending local sports clubs outside of school. To improve this, we will be looking at making links with other schools within our cluster and holding more sport competitions between our federation of schools. We would like to improve confidence in staff members in order to run more after school activities. Each school has one after school session a week with the Sports Development Officer. This is something we would like to expand on and offer a wider variety of sports and activities with different staff members. Low attendance numbers at Beswick sports club will be assessed and plans will be put in place to work with children and parents to find a solution and boost numbers. We will plan to work across the federation and have three events each year where the three schools in the federation compete in a competitive sports competition. We will plan how we can utilise our gymnastic equipment across the curriculum to make lessons more active.

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Low numbers in KS1 clubs last year have increased with the introduction of play leaders.	
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What does the Sport Premium mean for our school?

'Schools must use the funding to make additional and sustainable improvements to quality of physical education (PE), physical activity and sport you offer.' (DFE website Oct 2018). At the Wolds Federation we have looked at the 5 key indicators.

1. The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity – kick starting a healthy active lifestyle
2. The profile of PE and sport being raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement
3. Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport
4. Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils
5. Increased participation in competitive sport
