

Sports Premium Projected Spend/Impact 2020

The Wolds Federation Sports Premium 2019-2020

At The Wolds Federation we believe PE & Sport plays an important role in making our vision statement a reality for every pupil, with potential to change young people's lives for the better.

We have welcomed the Government's announcement in June 2013 to provide additional funding until 2020 to improve provision of physical education and sport in primary schools. We are committed to using this resource in developing high quality PE lessons, alongside greater opportunities for sporting competitions and clubs for all our young people. Sport Premium Grant Funding for schools will be calculated by the number of primary aged pupils (between the ages of 5 and 11). All the schools with 17 or more primary aged pupils will receive a lump sum of £16,000 plus a premium of £10 per pupil. Smaller schools will receive £1000 per pupil.

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Key achievements to date:	Areas for further improvement and baseline evidence of need:
Plans in place to achieve a silver school games award, which would have seen an improvement on bronze from the previous year. The introduction of 5-minute brain breaks which increases children's daily physical activity. We have participated in 100% of School Sport competitions up until March 2020. An achievement which surpasses 95% on the previous year. We are very proud of this as it sees our small federation of schools working closely together. Every child participates in high quality Physical Education. Every child across KS2 has had the opportunity to participate in a range of competitive sports during the academic year. Many of our children across EYFS to KS2 feedback that they enjoy being active at school. Our after-school sports clubs have been well attended thanks to the introduction of new activities such as archery, kickball and cross country. Our Sports leader programme has been very successful with children leading sessions.	Although many of our children feedback they enjoy being active during the school day and many attend our extra-curricular clubs at school, there is a decline in children attending local sports clubs. To improve this, we will look to increase our links with local sports clubs so children have more confidence to attend clubs away from school. Our KS1 sports clubs are not as well attended as the KS2 club. This is something we are working on to improve numbers. We would like to continue to improve confidence in staff members in order to run more after school activities. Each school has one after school session a week with the Sports Development Officer. This is something we would like to expand on and offer a wider variety of sports and activities with different staff members. We will plan to work across the federation and have three events each year where the three schools in the federation compete in a competitive sports competition (two have taken place although the last one had to be postponed due to not being in school) We will plan how we can utilise our gymnastic equipment across the curriculum to make lessons more active (carry over from last year due to not being in school)

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What does the Sport Premium mean for our school?

'Schools must use the funding to make additional and sustainable improvements to quality of physical education (PE), physical activity and sport you offer.'(DFE website Oct 2018). At the Wolds Federation we have looked at the 5 key indicators.

1. The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity – kick starting a healthy active lifestyle
2. The profile of PE and sport being raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement
3. Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport
4. Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils
5. Increased participation in competitive sport

Sports Development Officer continued to work across the federation. (Reception, KS1 & KS2)	The SDO has been employed to develop all aspects of sport across the federation with a focus on competitive sport, health and wellbeing and developing a lifelong love of sport. This allows all children to have access to a high quality physical education. Staff gain access to CPD and training offered through the SDO. Children are given the opportunity to take part in play leader courses and have the chance to take part in cluster lead sport competition.	£21,938 (Divided equally between the three schools in the Wolds Federation)
We continue to work with the Driffield Sports Partnership	Children in all year groups across the federation have access to inter-school competitions and events throughout the year. Children can compete in a variety of different events suitable for all abilities.	£1500 (£500 per school)
Access to new sports and activities	Purchasing of archery equipment has improved our afterschool numbers by 25%. We have seen a rise in the number of different children also attending. Hand ball equipment has also had a positive effect on numbers of people attending afterschool clubs, especially with year groups 3 and 4, we are seeing more children in these years attending.	£2000 Cover the cost of external agents offering and running clubs
Purchasing of new sports equipment	To provide quality equipment for children to use during games and PE lessons. This will give staff the tools they require to deliver the highest standard of session. Sports offered at school will be increased as we can access more equipment allowing more ideas for sessions.	£5000 Maintaining equipment safety and the ability to offer varied sports
Offer a range of afterschool activities	Children across the federation will have access to a range of after school activities. This will help develop the standard of sport within the three schools whilst allowing children the opportunity to experience a wider variety of sports. We will continue to look to develop links with other schools and clubs.	Comes under the cost of SDO £2500 External agents and club coach costs

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Continue to offer CPD courses across the federation	Staff will continue to have access to quality courses that allow them to improve their knowledge leading to higher quality PE lessons. They will continue to work alongside the SDO to maintain confidence and apply new skills. Lunchtime staff will also be providing positive play and active play times to assist with the player leaders' activities.	£3000
Transport costs to organised events	Children across the federation will have continued access to activities and competitive sports during their time at school that would otherwise not be readily accessible on the school site. Driffield Sports Hall athletics and two federation sports days were attended by all three of our federation schools. Transport for Beswick and Watton primary school to travel to Middleton for use of indoor hall during the winter term.	£2500
Training of Play Leaders	Play leaders will again receive training through the SDO. The play leaders will be trained in health and safety, planning, organising and communicating the leading of games. The play leaders have already had an impact and improved lunchtime behaviour and this will only continue to improve further with the help of organised activities. Play leaders is a good start for children who don't feel confident in taking part in after school clubs or competitive sports. The aim is to build confidence in children and encourage them to take part in more activities. Play leaders carry on each year with the next year group taking over from the previous year 6.	£1500

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Purchase playground equipment to enhance the provision in the outdoor areas	After talking to children and undertaking a survey conducted by the year 6 sports council, we were able to purchase the type of equipment that the pupils would use to enable them to increase the time they take part in physical activity.	£4500
Weekly Sports Award Trophy	Sports trophy rewarded to a child each week for effort and/or skills shown in PE. This award is given in celebration assembly at the end of the week to show the whole school the importance of PE throughout the schools and to celebrate individual children's sporting achievements.	£150 (£50 per school)

- Due to school closure there is an underspend of £3,858
- This money was set to be used for summer activities and participation in inter-school competitions
- This would have included summer smash cricket and the Brown-Lee Triathlon
