

Artists to be studied over the course of both KS1 and KS2

- The national curriculum asks that children look at the work of artists and designers over a range of genres and over a wide range of time periods. We cannot expect that we can study these artists in great detail but this list is provided as suggested artists. I have tried to cover artists from a wide variety of backgrounds, ethnicities, from different countries, who use different techniques and approaches and also of different genders. There is also a balance of “the great masters of painting” and more contemporary artists working today.
- There are no specific links to African art, aboriginal art, Aztec art, cave painting etc. I am assuming that these will be looked at as part of the “topic art”
- I have linked them where possible to the topics studied.
- These are only suggestions and it would be great to add to the list as we go through the topics.
